**Have you seen a Comma butterfly?**

The distinctive Comma butterfly has been spreading north and has been seen throughout most of south eastern Scotland. We need your help to map its distribution, so please report any sightings via this postcard, or online at [www.butterfly-conservation.org/scottishcommasurvey](http://www.butterfly-conservation.org/scottishcommasurvey).

The Comma over-winters as an adult and flies in gardens and other flowery places mainly between March and May, and again from July to October. Its caterpillars feed on elm and nettles.
