Phase I
30 sites across
Tayside

10 each in Angus, Perthshire & Kinross



Each site selected as know population of Tree Sparrows

Purpose to secure populations as the UK population has shown huge declines over the last decade and beyond



End of phase I was the surveying of uptake of these boxes

Carried out during winter, once frost had killed parasites.

Repeated winter 2009 in phase II of the project.



13 out of 30 sites used by Tree Sparrows (43%)

42 out of 360 boxes used by Tree Sparrows (12%)

Only 16 boxes not used by something (4%)





Large number of boxes used for nesting by Tits.



Some used by small birds for roosting.

Some contained wasp bykes.

One used as acorn store by a mouse.



STTS - Phase II

Purpose of project is to further expand the populations that have been secured through Phase I.

Includes an aspect of educating primary school pupils about issues involved in the decline of the species.



In Angus

- Another 10 sites have has 12 boxes erected.
 - Near to the initial 10 sites from Phase I
- Neighbouring farm or another area if an estate

Purpose is to now try and encourage spread of the populations secured in Phase I

The Linnet Link —

Enhancing the cycle track from Arbroath to Dundee for Linnets



Whole length of cycle track surveyed to identify priority areas for making links to improve habitat for Linnets.



Surveys also carried out to see where Linnets were present and so where links would be of most value.



Linnets like habitat such as hedges & shrubs



Linnets survey only found Linnets near hedges or trees, validating the value of linking these habitats along the cycle track.



Shrubs planted:

Hawthorn

Blackthorn

Hazel

Dogwood

Rose spp.
